TOURNAMENT RESULTS

U.S. Go Congress:

6-14th August

The overall winner was Lee K Y (6d). John Rickard won the 4 dan division, Nick Webber won the 3 dan division with Andrew Jones in 5th place and Tony Warburton won the 1 kyu division. In the Diehard competition (played on the day off) John Rickard and Jim Clare both won prizes for 3/4. The Pair Go event was played in tables with a second stage play-off. Matthew Macfadyen and Kirsty Healey won their first stage table with Alison Jones and Richard Hunter second. In the Lightning, Jim Clare and Paul Margetts both won first stage tables. Most importantly, the British Team won the International Friendship Match against teams from the US, Canada, Europe and Japan.

North-East Team Go Tournament:

Saturday 20th August

Eight teams of three players competed in this innovative event, with games played with handicaps. Teams came from Edinburgh (2), Hull, Leicester, London, Newcastle, Teesside and Wanstead. The winners were Wanstead (Andrew and Alison Jones and Alistair Wall). Alison was the only player with 4/4. The organisers would be interested to hear ideas for different formats.

20th Northern Go Tournament: (EGP)

Weekend 3-4th September

75 players attended the Northern Tournament in Manchester with its European Grand Prix status, but alas no Europeans (other than us of course). In the end, even the tie-break system was unable to separate the joint winners Des Cann (4d Leamington) and Matthew Cocke (4d) both with 5½/6. Simon Shiu (3d Teesside) came third. Other winners with 5/6 were: David King (5k Br'hale), Wayne Walters (5k Wanstead), and Tim Reckett (10k Manchester). Mark Harrod (16k Brakenhale) and Tom Summerscales (19k Culcheth) both with 4/6 also won prizes. Qualifiers for the Candidates' Tournament were: Baron Allday, Simon Bexfield, Paul Mellor, Eddie Smithers and Peter Yim.

International Team Tournament:

12th September

This contest between teams of 12 players was won by Central London after beating a Japanese team and Wanstead. Players with 3/3 were: Obayashi, Kasai, Rix, May and Barthropp.

Okabe Cup Team Tournament:

12th September

This match for kyu players at the same time as the above event was between teams of 5 players. It was won by Brighton on a tie break from Central London. Jim Sadler won 3/3.

Milton Keynes Go Tournament:

Saturday 17th September

There were 71 players at this tournament which was won by Edmund Shaw (5d Reading). Other prize winners with 3/3 were: Toby Manning (2d Learnington), Daniel Cox (7k Brakenhale), Anna Griffiths (14k Maidenhead), Paul Clarke (20k High Wycombe) and Nicola Hurden (28k Brakenhale). The winners were Alison Jones & Nick Webber, who will be our representatives in the World event in Japan later in the year. Second were Kirsty Healey & Des Cann, third were Sue Patterson & Edmund Shaw, and fourth were Helen Harvey & Bob Bagot.

Shrewsbury Go Tournament:

The overall winner was Des Cann after a ½ point win over runner-up Francis Roads. Other prizes were awarded to division winners: David Woodnutt (1d OU), Paul Barnard (1k Swindon), John Herman (5k Manchester), John Gardner (9k Culcheth), Mark Harrod (14k Brakenhale), Richard Dowling (22k Brakenhale). Here is the latest from our Japan correspondent, Brian Chandler:

Japanese news

Cho Chi-kun held on to his Honinbo title, just beating Kataoka 4-3 in the final in July. The Meijin league was extremely closely fought, with three people (Cho, Rin and Kato, in seeding order) all ending on 6-2. Rin won the playoff, and is currently 0-2 down in the best-of-seven challenge to Kobayashi Koichi. Meanwhile, Rin took the Gosei title from Kobayashi 3-1 in August. Hashimoto Utaro 9-dan, holder of many titles in the 1950s and 60s, died on July 24th at the age of 87. He was still active, being the commentator in the NHK tournament game broadcast posthumously on July 31st.

International news:

Cho Hun-hyun (Korea) won the Korean Dong-Yang Securities Cup, beating Yoda-Norimoto (Japan) 3-1 in the best-of-five final (June 22nd Seoul). He (Cho) also took the Fujitsu World Cup title held in Tokyo in August. Rin Kaiho managed to lose the Japan-China Tengen/Tianyuan/10-10-point challenge match 0-2 again, for the third year in a row. This time the Chinese Tianyuan he lost to was Ma Xiao-chun. (Never mind, the Japanese player won the first four of the seven matches so far). Otake, NHK Cup holder, won the Asia TV tournament which matches the winners of the various TV tournaments in China, Japan and Korea. (Held in Pusan, Korea and televised in August).

Andy Finch sends some news from the Korean viewpoint:

Cho Hun-hyun won one billion Korean Won (about £80,000) for his win in the Dong-Yang Securities Cup. The Koreans were very pleased that the final of the Fujitsu Cup held in Tokyo was between two Koreans, Cho beating Choi Kyu-byong 4-1. Lee Chang-ho, one of his main rivals, doesn't play in international events since he is still at school and has to stay in the country during school terms. Here is the current standing of the leading Korean pros in tournament games this year: 1: Suh Bong-soo 9-dan (25-9 = 73.5%), 2: Lee Chang-ho 7-dan (39-16 = 71%), 3: Jang Soo-yong 9-dan (18-8 = 69.2%), 4=: Cho Hun-hyun 9-dan (35-21 = 62.5%), 4=: Kim Soo-jang 9-dan (20-12 = 62.5%).
