Here is the latest from our Japan Correspondent, Brian Chandler:

All change! Cho Chi-kun has taken the Oza title from Kato 3-2, and Ryu Shi-kun (only 23 and originally from Korea) has taken the Tengen title from Rin 3-1. Also Ma Xiao-chun 'Mingren' beat Kobayashi Koichi 'Meijin' 2-1 in one of those matches between same-in-Chinese-and-Japanese titleholders. Rui Naiwei, 9-dan of China, won the Bo-hae* Women's World Championship in Seoul, beating Feng-Yun 2-1. [* Help! I guess this is a Korean sponsor, and can only guess the pronunciation from my dictionary.] Kobayashi Satoru and Cho Chi-kun are tied 1-1 in the Kisei final. Kobayashi won the second game in only 69 moves, without even going into the second day.
